Changes to the ALIA CPD Scheme from 1 July



The ALIA CPD Scheme, one of ALIA's most valued member benefits, is having a makeover! The following changes will come into effect on 1 July 2024:

- The scheme will now be available to all personal members including student and general members.
- Specialisation competencies will be aligned to the ALIA LIS Workforce Framework.
- All participants will receive annually updated certificates acknowledging CPD hours and years in the scheme.
- Professional members can achieve Certified Professional (CP) Status after one year of 30 hours, and Distinguished Certified Professional status after five years in the scheme and 150 hours of CPD (previously 200 hours).







Record and reflect

Your CPD logbook is in your Member Centre when you are logged into the ALIA website. It provides a consistent place for you to record and reflect on your professional learning activities, consolidating your learning. Over time it becomes a wonderful resource that makes your professional progress visible. You will be able to log your CPD for the previous CPD year (1 July – 30 June) until 31 December.

Be recognised

Keeping a dedicated log of your CPD activities not only gives you a sense of achievement, your efforts are acknowledged by ALIA with formal certificates of recognition. If you are a professional member, the Certified Professional (CP) postnominal is available after one year in the scheme.

Promote your professional achievement

Refer to your involvement in the CPD Scheme in job interviews, in workplace reviews and your online profiles. Being a lifelong learner is something to be proud of and celebrate!

ALIA National Conference 2024 is the perfect opportunity to boost your CPD hours and to clarify your new learning by reflecting on your experiences.

You have several options for recording your conference activities in your CPD logbook. It's completely up to you which way you choose:
